- 1. Imagine that you are a famous daytime talk show host interviewing the four lovers at the point when Demetrius and Lysander are both in love with Helena, and Helena and Hermia are puzzled by the recent change of affection in the young men. Write a short episode (2-5 pages) using the title "Friends who ______." Ensure that your final copy is edited and typed (Individual or Partner) **OR** film a re-enactment to show the class (Group of 3-5)
- 2. Design a poster advertising a presentation of Shakespeare's play *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Be sure to include the location, time, cast of actors, "ratings" or quotes from critics, and colourful illustrations. (Individual)
- 3. Create a diorama displaying a scene from the play. Be sure to include a label indicating which Act and Scene from the play you are displaying and a short written summary of the scene. (Individual or Partner)
- 4. Write a poem (at least five stanzas) that summarizes the events of the play *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Be sure to include all of the characters and plot twists. Print/type the finished poem and include an appropriate illustration. (Individual)
- 5. Choose one of the scenes and create a comic book version. Include the necessary characters and dialogue. Remember to indicate at the beginning which Act and Scene you are presenting. Have 8-12 frames in your comic. (Individual or Partner)
